Giving Thanks for New Neighbor Interfaith Alliance By Candy Warner



NNIA (New Neighbor Interfaith Alliance) serves the immigrant community in Gaithersburg, Rockville, Germantown, and other nearby growth areas. GBCI is one of the 24 faith communities and local organizations who are supportive of NNIA efforts. This Fall GBCI had several events with NNIA families and

volunteers. In September, we held a tea at Asbury for the NNIA Monthly Women's

Circle which gathered the New Neighbor moms to talk and connect with volunteers and each other. The intent was to offer the women an opportunity to experience feelings of togetherness and connection by taking part in a ritual with deep cultural roots. After tea, the Williamsburg Clothes Closet opened its doors to the community, and the women were delighted to select what they liked from items of clothing that were donated to the clothes closet. The ample selection of available clothing allowed each woman to take home at least two shopping bags full of clothes. Many thanks to Barbara Brennan and Kay Allanbach and her compatriots who brought such smiles to the women. A week later, many of the New Neighbor families and volunteers attended GBCI's Community Day at the event tent at AMV. It was a beautiful fall day!

At the October NNIA information meeting for volunteers, we learned that NNIA is currently serving 143 immigrants and refugees: 25 Afghan families, and 2 Syrian, 11 Guatemalan, 2 Ethiopian, and additional families from Ukraine, Haiti, Iraq, Colombia, and Peru. In early November, one Afghan family presented their harrowing detailed talk at St. Francis Parish about their arrival to the United States via South America. NNIA welcomed them to Montgomery County and found them housing, food, clothing, and helped them survive.

An Applause for MCAEL and Mujer Fuerza y Coraje for Increasing English Literacy in Montgomery County

A rich discussion on english literacy in Montgomery County happened at GBCI's November Monthly Meeting with guest speakers: Kathy Stevens and Grace Karambiri from Montgomery Coalition for Adult English Literacy (MCAEL), Milagro Flores, founder of Mujer Fuerza y Coraje and English Conversation Coordinator, Mirna Zetino, Mujer Fuerza y Coraje member and student in GBCI's English Conversation program, and Allyson Owers, AMV volunteer in the English Conversation program. **MCAEL** is Montgomery County's literacy coalition working to strengthen and build adult English language learning programs to further individual and family success at work, school and in the community. GBCI has benefited greatly from

MCAEL's resources and trainings, and relies on MCAEL's network to connect students to additional English classes in the county. **Mujer Fuerza y Coraje**, or Women of Strength and Courage, is a community group of hundreds of Latina women members that connects and supports women and children in the Gaithersburg area. GBCI's English Conversation program would not be where it is today without the partnership with Mujer Fuerza y Coraje. Milagro and Mirna spoke about their commitment to learning English to be role models for their children and expand work opportunities.





They both shared that they have not only learned a lot from the volunteer instructors, but they have gained so much through the relationships that have grown from coming to the class. "The students come to English class and find what is like a family," Milagro said. Allyson Owers, an AMV resident who helps lead the beginner English class, shared how showing up to volunteer once a week in the class has greater impact than one would think. Students are not in many English-speaking spaces, so the conversation exchange is productive and fun. Volunteers learn a lot from the students, too. Hats off to all the leaders who are working to improve English literacy here in the Gaithersburg and across Montgomery County!
