GBCI's offices are located at Asbury Methodist Village.

## Summer Volunteers Weed Out Invasive Plants at Asbury w/ Habitat Action Committee by Janet Neumann

This summer, GBCI Program Coordinator, Sarahi Segura coordinated with the Habitat Action Committee (HAC) to provide volunteer hours for local students affiliated with GBCI at Asbury Methodist Village (AMV). Over four mornings in early July, the students helped HAC members pull invasive mile-a-minute weeds in the AMV wildlife area. These weeds can grow up to 25 inches long and rapidly smother other plants in the area they invade. This combined team of 'weed worriers' cleared a large area along Summit Avenue where fall seeds of native plants and flowers will be planted.

We couldn't have cleared this area without these hardworking students. They pulled these invasives during some of the hottest mornings so far this summer. Our goal was to pull mile-a-minute before it went to seed which

greatly reduces the amount that will grow again next year. It was so thick in the area along Summit Avenue that it was impossible to walk through. We hope that some of these students will return next year to help the AMV HAC continue to get invasives under control and allow our native plants to thrive. I cannot stress enough our appreciation for these students' efforts and the benefit to our nature area.

In return, HAC members taught the students about how invasive plants can outcompete desirable natives, why native plants are beneficial, and about the natural area at Asbury. Students also received student service-learning hours for their volunteer efforts. It was a wonderful experience for everyone!

Residents, students, and community members of Gaithersburg dedicate their time to assist with lessons and set up activities so that our programs can run smoothly. Hello Beloved Community readers, I am Sarah, a 10th grade student at Albert Einstein High School and I have been volunteering with Gaithersburg Beloved Community Initiative for two years now. My experience has been enlightening, to say the least as I developed important skills in communication, patience, and most of all compassion. I have been passionate about volunteering since I was young. When I was in elementary school, I testified in front of the board of education to support afterschool programs at my school (EBB), packed food boxes for food-
