The GHS Cosmetology program is part of the Career Technology Education (CTE) department that helps guide students aspiring to start a career by increasing access and opportunity. Cosmetology

students learn the art and science of cosmetology and necessary aspects of the industry. They are supervised by licensed cosmetology educators and learn current styles and trends while performing salon services for a variety of clients at the in-school salon. Students also train with professionals in local salons and obtain the practical and clinical experience needed to take the Maryland State Board of Cosmetologist License examination.
